

- Best practices for integrating digital tools into non-formal education.







WHAT TO DO IN CUENCA!

Cuenca is a UNESCO World Heritage City, known for its stunning medieval architecture, dramatic cliffs, and rich cultural heritage. Nestled between deep gorges, it offers a perfect blend of history, art, and nature. Its unique charm, breathtaking landscapes, and vibrant local culture make it a must-visit destination.



PLACES TO VISIT:

- Hanging Houses (Casas Colgadas) Iconic medieval houses suspended over a cliff.
- San Pablo Bridge A panoramic walkway with spectacular views of the city.
- Cuenca Cathedral A remarkable Gothic cathedral with impressive interiors.
- Abstract Art Museum A unique collection inside one of the Hanging Houses.
- Serranía de Cuenca Natural Park Stunning rock formations and hiking trails.
- Enchanted City (Ciudad Encantada) A surreal landscape of natural rock sculptures.
- Plaza Mayor The heart of Cuenca, surrounded by colorful historic buildings.
- Mangana Tower A historic watchtower offering great views of the old town.

HOW TO GET TO CUENCA:

- Cuenca is easily accessible from major Spanish cities. The fastest option is the **high-speed train** (AVE) from Madrid, which takes less than an hour.
- Regular trains and buses are also available from cities like Valencia and Alicante.
- If arriving by plane, the nearest major airport is **Madrid-Barajas (MAD)**, from where you can take a train or bus to Cuenca. Once in the city, you can explore most attractions on foot or by local transport.
