Training Course "Art of Being Creative -ABC training on creativity for social inclusion"

Gonio, Georgia, 15-23 October 2023

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ABOUT THE PROJECT

"ABC" is a uniquely designed training aimed at improving social inclusion and bringing change to local communities through the development of creativity fluency, social competences in theatre and improvisation, collaboration and creation of new projects.

The first step for a change, improvement or innovation is always creativity, creative ideas and thoughts. We become creative when we are in need, and right now European society is in need of inclusive activities and methods for working with different groups of people due to the drastic changes in demographics, increased migration and population transition.

Therefore, our goal is to define and share the peculiarities of youth work in the participating countries, to design follow-up local projects aimed at improving social inclusion and community development through combination of NFE activities that will involve creative thinking tools and problem-solving methods along with improvisation theatre and games.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

For 7 days, 39 youth workers will deeply dive into the topic, playing, discovering and assimilating our working methods suitable for small and large groups. The goal of this activity is to boost your creativity, develop your competences and skills of creative thinking and problem-solving, to equip you with relevant methods and tools in order to create and design follow-up local projects aimed at improving social inclusion and community development in your countries. The learning by doing approach ensures many interactive activities, such as role-plays, simulations, improvisation theatre techniques and sharing best practices. We will have long debrief sessions on all the elements of each method, ensuring a detailed understanding for all participants.



OBJECTIVES

Throughout the training, moving in the direction: practice -> debriefing -> awareness -> theoretical inputs and support -> skills development, we want:

to boost creativity fluency through improvisation theatre, games and other NFE activities; to encourage creativity usage in everyday situations, as well as in solving local and global problems using a competency-based approach;

to improve social, interpersonal and communication competences, as well as to boost creativity through NFE and peer education;

to provide youth/social workers, educators and future leaders with the tools for creative thinking and problem-solving skills development (that will result in creating follow-up projects for their local communities);

to create follow-up local projects aimed for community development through social inclusion of marginalized youth and other social groups with fewer opportunities;

OBJECTIVES

to provide a partnership building platform for NGO workers that specialize on working with people with fewer opportunities, migrants, refugees and marginal groups;

to promote positive and respectful attitudes toward various cultures, people and their specialty; to develop the key competences and skills of self-reflection among the participants.



OUTCOMES AND IMPACT

During the training, we will:

- examine the applicability of creative methods and tools in social work dimension;
- discover, how the creative methods and tools can be used for the aims of social inclusion;
- define and examine the peculiarities of youth/social work in our countries;
- as an outcome, elaborate and design follow-up local projects aimed for social inclusion of various social groups at risk of exclusion, creation of new and alternative participation opportunities and, therefore, community development. The generation of projects ideas will be boosted by creativity fluency development and based on the knowledge and experience, gained during the project. From the ideas, we will proceed to planning, scheduling, defining the needs, aims, objectives, target groups, appropriate tools, needed resources, timeframes of realization, expected outcomes, digitalization and adjusting to online use (where applicable) as a result, we will get ready-to-be-realized planned and scheduled local follow-up projects.

Moreover, the participants and partner organizations will get methods and tools to boost and develop creative thinking, which later on they will be able to use in their follow-up activities.

Finally, the training will have a significant impact on the personal and professional development of the participants themselves.

PARTICIPANTS

Participant profile:

- 18+ years old youth/social workers/leaders/NGO key staff;
- responsible, motivated and open to the new experience and learning opportunities;
- open-minded and flexible towards new knowledge, viewpoints and perspectives;
- with knowledge and experience in working with NFL programs (desirable, but not mandatory);
- ready to contribute to the project implementation: share relevant knowledge and experience, organize a workshop, lead a session, etc.;
- ready to implement the project results in further work;
- with good command of English.

Keep in mind that the selection will be done strictly based on applications. The priority in the selection will be given to the participants with a relevant matching profile, constructive detailed application, as well as for participants with fewer opportunities.

During the first day of the training you will sign the learning agreement, stating your active involvement in all the project activities during the implementation stage and active contribution during the dissemination and follow-up stages.



During the second part, you will have the opportunity to organize your workshop or lead a session on the relevant topic; and after that in small groups, you will elaborate and design follow-up local projects aimed for social inclusion of various social groups at risk of exclusion, creation of new participation opportunities and community development.

- organize and conduct the elaborated follow-up local project, provide pictures from the activity and report on it (within maximum one month after the end of the training);
- contribute to the activities on dissemination of the Erasmus+ Programme, training course and learning outcomes, writing and sharing minimum one report and/or article about it in your social media and/or mass media.

Our Guest House in Gonio is located 14 km from the Batumi Railway Station, 8 km from the Batumi International Airport.

Accommodation


During the project we will live in a <u>Jujuna Guest House</u>. Address: <u>Gonio, Matata Motsikuli Street 56</u>.

The rooms will be shared between 2, 3 or 4 participants of the same gender from different countries. The rooms have individual bathrooms. Bed linen and towels are provided.

We will be provided with breakfast, lunch, dinner and 2 coffee breaks. The water is drinkable from the tap.

TRAVELLING

If you arrive to Tbilisi:

You can easily reach the Tbilisi Central Railway Station / Central Station via public transportation. Bus stop is just in front of the Departure Terminal of the Airport, from where you can take the bus #337, which terminates at the Tbilisi Central Station. It will cost you less than 1 Euro, but you should have Georgian Lari (GEL) coins.

You can check more about Airport transfer here.

From the Tbilisi Central Railway station, which is just behind of the Tbilisi Central Station, you can take train, probably, the most safe and shortest way to Batumi.

In order to get reimbursed, you have to book the 2nd class ticket (and still be in the travel budget).

You can book Tbilisi-Batumi train tickets online here.

From the Batumi Railway Station, the best option is to order the <u>Bolt</u> or <u>Yandex Go</u> taxi via application to the project venue: <u>Gonio, Jujuna Guest House, Matata Motsikuli Street 56</u>, which will cost you nearly 5 Euro for the car (you can also share the car with others).

If you still decide to reach Batumi from Tbilisi by bus, or you cannot manage to get train tickets, the Tbilisi Central Bus station is just next to the Central Railway Station, where you can buy the tickets on spot in the Ticket Office. After arrival to the Batumi Bus station, the Bolt or Yandex Go taxi is the best option to reach the project venue: Gonio, Jujuna Guest House, Matata Motsikuli Street 56, which will cost you nearly 5 Euro for the car (you can also share the car with others).



TRAVELLING

If you arrive to Kutaisi:

Option 1: Booking in advance the bus ticket Kutaisi Airport – Batumi <u>here</u> and after ordering the <u>Bolt</u> or <u>Yandex Go</u> taxi via application to the project venue: <u>Gonio, Jujuna Guest House, Matata Motsikuli Street 56</u>, which will cost you nearly 5 Euro for the car (you can also share the car with others).

Option 2: Booking in advance the train ticket Kutaisi Airport – Batumi <u>here</u> (just keep in mind that the Kutaisi Railway Station is around 2 km away from the airport).

From the Batumi Railway Station, the best option is to order the <u>Bolt</u> or <u>Yandex Go</u> taxi via application to the project venue: <u>Gonio, Jujuna Guest House, Matata Motsikuli Street 56</u>, which will cost you nearly 5 Euro for the car (you can also share the car with others).

If you arrive to Batumi:

You just simply order the <u>Bolt</u> or <u>Yandex Go</u> taxi via application to the project venue: <u>Gonio, Jujuna Guest House, Matata</u> <u>Motsikuli Street 56</u>, which will cost you nearly 5 Euro for the car (you can also share the car with others).

Check-in time: 15th October at the venue, after 15:00! In case you arrive earlier, we cannot guarantee early check-in!
