Objectives

- PROVIDE YOUTH WORKERS WITH PRACTICAL TOOLS AND STRATEGIES FOR COUNTERACTING XENOPHOBIA AND RACISM
- ENHANCE THE KNOWLEDGE AMONG YOUTH WORKERS ABOUT ANTI-RACISM AND SOCIAL JUSTICE
- CREATE NEW ANTI-RACIST PROJECTS
 AND INITIATIVES

Principles

- AN INTERSECTIONAL ANALYSIS OF SOCIAL (IN)JUSTICE
- DEMOCRATIC PRINCIPLES
- CRITICAL THINKING
- SYSTEMIC APPROACHES TO SOCIAL CHANGE



Methods

1. SYSTEMIC APPROACH

- UNDERSTANDING THAT INDIVIDUALS ARE EMBEDDED IN A SOCIAL CONTEXT TINGED BY POWER STRUCTURES
- FOCUSING ON RELATIONSHIPS, FOR EXAMPLE BETWEEN "YOUTH WORKER" AND "TARGET GROUP"
- INCLUDING REFLEXIVITY OVER ONE'S RELATION
 TO THE TARGET GROUP

2. POPULAR EDUCATION

- EDUCATION OF THE PEOPLE, BY THE PEOPLE AND TO THE PEOPLE
- ACTIVE PEDAGOGIES = LEARNING BY DOING
- ENCOUNTER OF COLD (ACADEMIC) AND HOT (EXPERIENTIAL) KNOWLEDGES
- COLLECTIVE LEARNING
- POLITICAL EDUCATION AIMED AT SOCIAL CHANGE

3. INTERSECTIONAL LEARNING

- UNDERSTANDING THAT POWER STRUCTURES AND OPPRESSION OVERLAP AND COEXIST
- EXPLORING HOW TO APPLY INTERSECTIONAL METHODS INTO SOCIAL JUSTICE WORK AND ANTIRACIST PROJECTS

4. THEATRE OF THE OPPRESSED

- A METHOD DEVELOPED IN THE 1970'S IN BRAZIL
- AIMS TO DECONSTRUCT SYSTEMIC SOCIAL INEQUALITIES BASED ON THE EXPERIENCES AND PERSPECTIVES OF MARGINALISED GROUPS
- INVITES PARTICIPANTS TO PHYSICALLY JOIN THE STAGE, BROADENING THEIR ROLE FROM SPECTATORS TO SPECT-ACTORS.

5. DRIV (TC1)

- PEACEWORKS' METHOD FOR PROJECT MANAGEMENT
- INCLUDES ELEMENTS SUCH AS; NORM
 CRITICISM AND POWER ANALYSIS;
 COOPERATION STRATEGIES; VISION AND GOAL
 FORMULATION; PROJECT PLANNING

WHERE?

 The course venue is located in Österfärnebo, north of Stockholm.

TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS

- You will be reimbursed for your ticket to and from Sweden - up to the limits which are seen in the table to the right.
- We will arrange joint transportation to and from the venue: departure from Stockholm Central Station on the 5th of March. Selected participants will receive more information about this in the weeks prior to the training.

PRACTICALS

- You will be staying at Färnebo Folkhögskola in two different houses where you will be divided into shared rooms in groups of 2 or 3.
- In the 2 houses there are 2 shared bathroom facilities per house.
- Meals will be provided 3 times per day in addition to some light refreshments in between sessions.
