Emergency Medical Teams (EMT's) are becoming an increasingly important part of the global health workforce, playing a fundamental role in disaster and crisis management. EMT Teams, consisting of volunteer paramedics, are equipped with the ability to be ready for crisis and disaster situations at any time and to rapidly deploy to the region. They are qualified, trained, equipped and supplied teams to properly respond to emergencies and not to burden local services.

- In October 2023, a 3-week EMT mobile field hospital installation drill will be conducted.
- EMT volunteers will carry out the installation of all materials available.
- The mobile field hospital facility, which includes polyclinic, isolation, wet floor, shelter, kitchen, and emergency departments on approximately 2 acres of land, will be completed with our emergency health team of 30 people
