Cink Venturing is a consulting firm established in 2011, specializing in entrepreneurship, open innovation, and the development of entrepreneurial ecosystems. With a proven track record of leading over 400 public and private initiatives and supporting more than 5,000 projects and SMEs, Cink fosters innovation and sustainable growth across diverse sectors, including digitalization, green entrepreneurship, and social innovation. The organization collaborates closely with public and private entities to design and implement impactful initiatives that drive economic development and inclusivity. Key areas of activity include: Startup incubation and acceleration: Providing tailored mentoring, training, and networking opportunities to startups and SMEs. Open innovation programs: Facilitating partnerships between startups and corporations to address specific innovation challenges. Promoting entrepreneurial culture: Delivering training programs to inspire innovation among youth, women, and underrepresented groups. The organization has designed and implemented numerous impactful initiatives that combine training, mentoring, and innovation-driven approaches to address both local and global challenges.
	1. NATIONAL PROJECTS
	Entrepreneurship in Equality (2023–ongoing). A business acceleration programme promoting gender equality by supporting projects with clear social impact. Notable examples include <i>Editorial Espinas</i> , a feminist publishing house highlighting women writers; <i>Women On Top</i> , an agency representing female athletes; <i>Mujeres en Farma</i> , boosting female talent in the pharmaceutical sector; <i>Saradi.nutrición</i> , addressing image and eating-related issues in women; and <i>Scientists 360º Academy</i> , providing STEM professionals with transversal skills such as leadership and technology transfer.



Las Rozas Next (2021–ongoing). Engages youth in innovation through challenges, forums, and mentorship. Successful projects include *Hosc App*, a suicide prevention app for children and adolescents, and *Atapia*, an Al-driven emotional assistant designed for educational settings.

<u>Startup Alcobendas (2020–ongoing).</u> Provides support for entrepreneurs in a collaborative innovation space, fostering sustainability-focused start-ups like *Bioturismo Global*, offering eco-tourism experiences, and *Foloou.me*, a high-precision voice guidance system for the visually impaired.

<u>Villaverde Business Incubator (2017–ongoing).</u> A comprehensive entrepreneurship ecosystem offering workspace, mentoring, and training with a focus on the social economy. Highlighted initiatives include *Inclusync*, innovative technologies for people with disabilities; *Latenting*, an app guiding youth in vocational orientation; and *Gundo Health and Food*, a nutritional recommendation app tailored to dietary restrictions or medical needs.

WOLARIA – Open Innovation Programme (2022–2023). This programme bridges the competitiveness challenges of regional companies with innovative start-up solutions, fostering the deployment of projects and the growth of start-ups. Cink's responsibilities include strategic planning, defining challenges, and facilitating open innovation processes, with a focus on sectors such as agrotech and foodtech. Notable collaborations include challenges with ITACyL, targeting water efficiency, precision agriculture, and sustainable farm management.

<u>Andalusian Start-up Investor Matchmaking Programme (2021–2023).</u> Cink facilitated a programme connecting technology-based Andalusian start-ups with foreign investors. Activities included start-up and investor scouting, advisory services, pitch preparation, and organising matchmaking events. The initiative emphasised technical and on-site support, equipping start-ups with the necessary resources and connections to secure investment and drive growth in sectors such as biotechnology and digital innovation.
