Liwan provides a physical (safe) space where youth (15– 35 years with a focus on young women) can freely convene, meet, discuss, debate, and organize into groups and initiatives to take an active part in the social change process and the public sphere. There is a difference between a place and a space. While the place provides a physical location, the space is created by those who interact with it.

Learning through doing invites a different learning experience by linking the practical application with theoretical knowledge through tangible and visible means. Youth who attend the space has often described it as a safe space; they feel the friendly atmosphere and the level of tolerance and acceptance make it welcoming to different youth segments.

Youth communities capable of self-actualization

OUR MISSION:

To facilitate and contribute to finding safe and alternative spaces, where young people understand themselves; realize the value of their tools and the importance of an active and constructive role in their communities, by providing opportunities for networking, learning, and specialized guidance.

OUR GOALS:

- Provide a physical facility that provides a safe space that is disability friendly.
- Facilitate learning and capacity building: for youth to develop self-awareness, stimulate individual and collective growth and build their capacities to voice up their issues and influence the invited space for engagement.
- Provide networking and opportunities for youth groups/initiatives and volunteers: to connect youth with other stakeholders who can support their engagement and activism, providing an arena to build solidarity around youth related issues across Jordan
- Provide technical support to develop other youth spaces and centers through a youth-centric approach and participatory modalities that are responsive to its environment and culture

What are the activities and experience of the organization in the areas relevant to this application?

Liwan Youth Space aims to support the capabilities of young men and women (from 15 to 35 years) to volunteer, learn, participate and be creative as active and influential members in building and developing their societies. We work to achieve that through the following overlapping roles, which are complementary and inseparable from each other:

- Operating as a supportive and safe place and forum for young men and women as well as youth groups and initiatives facilitating them to gather, meet and discuss their issues freely and in a safe atmosphere; so they can then organize themselves into groups and initiatives that contribute to the development of their communities.
- Offering learning opportunities for young men and women to develop their self-awareness, stimulate their individual and collective development and build their abilities to effectively express their issues and make a positive impact on themselves and their communities.
- Working as a platform for networking between young men and women and the rest of the partners concerned with supporting their participation and social initiatives, as a platform for solidarity and finding common denominators for youth issues throughout Jordan.
- Supporting the social creativity of youth, and what this requires of investing in youth
 organizing themselves and stimulating their cooperation together to propose solutions and
 alternatives that can contribute to the sustainable development of their societies (reducing
 social costs and increasing productivity).

Our activities fall under three main categories:

- 1. **Programs**: Planned ahead and have specific objectives to achieve, developed based on community needs and priorities.
- 2. Activities: Time-framed and -again- has specific objectives. The participants are either invited or chosen based on criteria. This category includes learning activities, capacity building, training, and networking activities
- 3. **Services**: Continuous and available all the time. This category includes hosting meetings and supporting youth initiatives by all available means.
