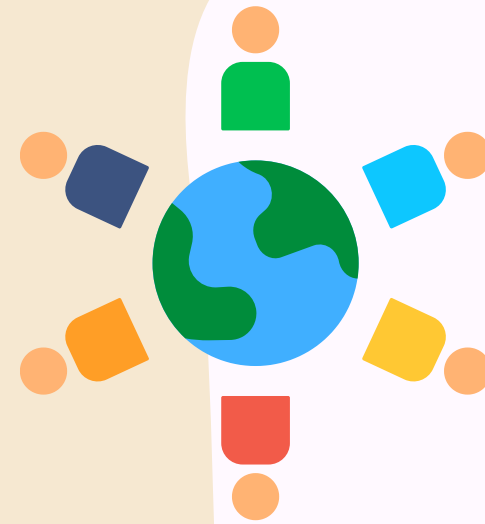


What we aim for?

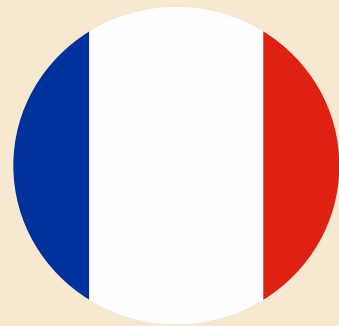

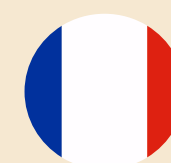

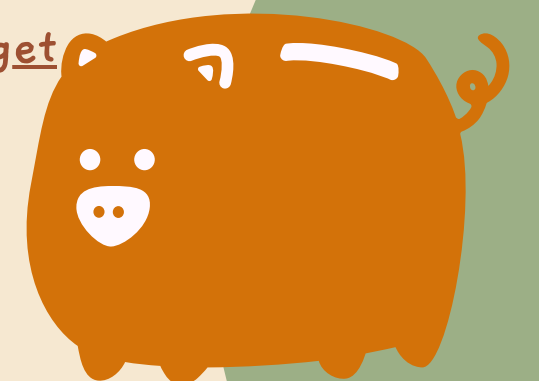

Let's talk about Ankara...

- Ankara is known for its modern architectural designs, with prominent examples like the iconic Atatürk Mausoleum (Anıtkabir) and the Middle East Technical University (METU) campus.
- is the birthplace of Angora cats, known for their long, silky fur. They are considered a national treasure in Turkey.
- hosts numerous embassies and foreign diplomatic missions, reflecting its role as Turkey's capital and a center for international diplomacy.
- houses the Turkish Parliament, Presidential Complex, and many government ministries, making it the political heart of the country.
- has a history that spans thousands of years, with influences from various civilizations such as the Hittites, Romans, Byzantines, and Ottomans.
- is home to several prestigious universities and educational institutions, attracting students from all over the country and abroad.
- Anıtkabir is the mausoleum of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, the founder of modern Turkey. It is an important symbol of national pride and is visited by millions of tourists each year.
- Ankara's population is a mix of different cultures and ethnicities, creating a vibrant and diverse social fabric.
- Ankara hosts various festivals and events throughout the year, including music, film, and cultural celebrations, adding to its lively atmosphere.

Where to visit in Ankara?

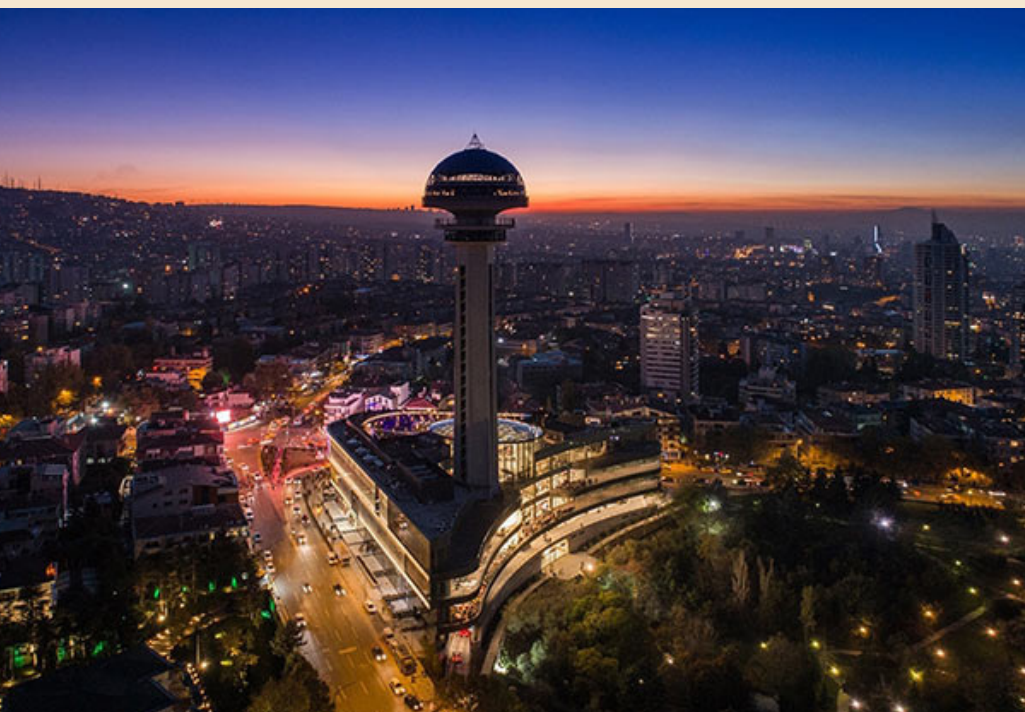


Anıtkabir

Located on an imposing hill in the Anıttepe quarter of the city is the mausoleum of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, the founder of the Republic of Turkey. The Museum of Ataturk and War of Independence is located inside Anıtkabir, including a large collection of Atatürk memorabilia and a section for the War of Independence containing panoramic views of the war fields. We show a big respect to Atatürk, and millions visit Anıtkabir each year.

The Lake of Eymir

Eymir Lake is located within the borders of Gölbaşı province. It's among the ideal spots for those who wish to make a daily visit, with its natural beauty, restaurants by the lakes and clean air. Eymir with its beautiful lakeside view and wildlife is also suitable for hiking and bicycle touring.



Atakule Tower

One of the highest structures of the city, with a shopping mall located under the tower. It is an observation tower, located in the Çankaya district. Also one of the primary landmarks of the city. As the district of Çankaya is itself on a hill, the tower can be spotted from almost anywhere in the city during clear days.

The Castle of Ankara

Standing above Ulus, on a high hill overlooking Ankara, Ankara Castle is a medieval citadel of more than a millennium old. Even though the exact date of its initial construction is unknown, some people believe the Hittites built the Ankara Castle. However, due to the lack of archeological artifacts to confirm this fact, the castle is more often associated with the Roman, Byzantine, and Seljuk eras.



Where to visit in Ankara?



Hamamönü District

Is a recently restored neighborhood with Ottoman style Ankara houses, and one of the most interesting parts of Ankara to visit. Located down the hill from Ankara Castle near Ulus, Hamamonu is an entire neighborhood of narrow streets, old houses and historic buildings. Most old houses are now restaurants, cafes or souvenir shops. Mehmet Akif Ersoy, the famous Turkish poet and writer of the Turkish National Anthem, had his house here, which is now a museum named after him.

Kızıllay District

The modern Kızıllay Square is the city's main shopping destination. It is a lively area where you can take a break in many cafes and restaurants. It also offers a good selection of cinemas. It is the busiest transportation hub in Ankara, connecting various forms of public transportation. It serves as a central point for the Ankara Metro, with Kızıllay Station being one of the main transfer stations for the metro lines.



Transportation from the Airport to Center

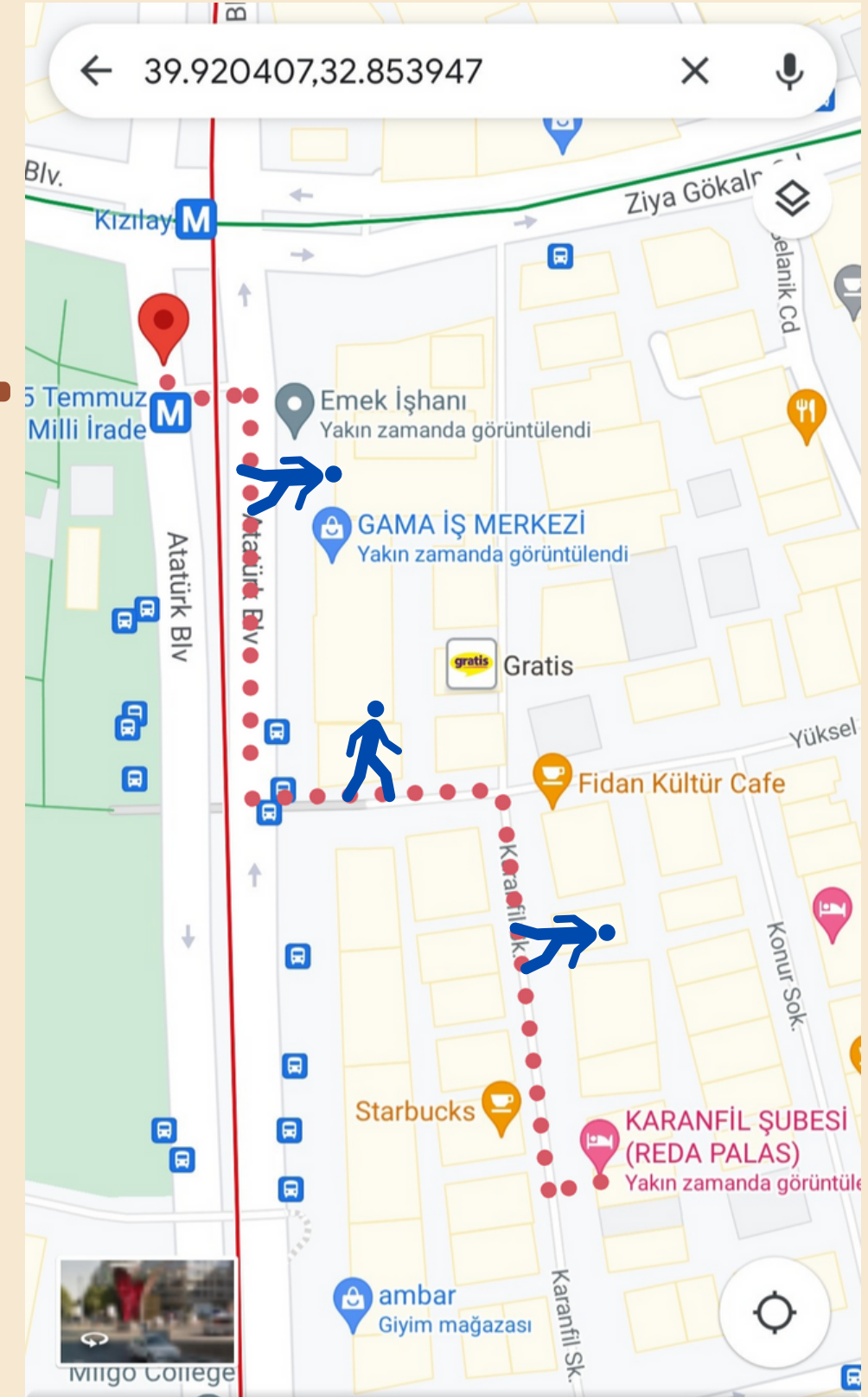
AIRPORT SHUTTLE

From the Ankara Esenboğa Airport, you should take the bus called BELKO AIR the ones goes towards KIZILAY. You should get off the bus at Güvenpark (Kızılay) stop. A one-way bus ticket to the city center costs 49.00 Turkish Liras (€1.80).

Just 5 minutes of walk!

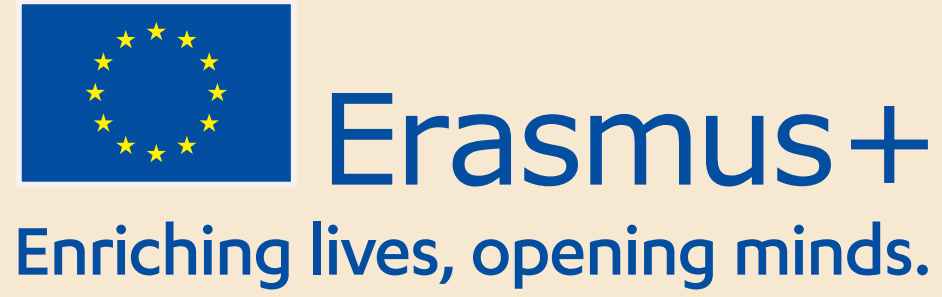


It might be hot during the day but bring warmer clothes for the nights as it will get cooler.
